Funded childcare hours for children of working parents - apply in plenty of time

If you are an eligible working parent, you can apply for:

✓ **Up to 30 hours childcare** per week over 38 weeks of the year, if you have a child between 9 months old and 4 years old. Your child must be at least 9 months old on or before 31 August.



If you plan to return to work from parental leave or start a new job by the end of September, you can also apply for a childcare code.

State Pension age for those born between 6 April 1960 and 5 March 1961

The Pensions Act 2014 set out the timescale for the increase in State Pension age from 66 to 67, affecting those born between 6 April 1960 and 5 March 1961. Anyone born between these dates should check their State Pension age to find out the earliest point at which they'll be eligible for their State Pension: State Pension age calculator
